

N131. Work Planning And Organization

This paper begins with a description of a structural approach to the ALARA procedure, including decision-aiding techniques, ALARA reviews, predicted ALARA planning, commitment to ALARA, and organizational structures such as the ALARA Committee, ALARA Coordinator, and the importance of work planning, including pre-job reviews, with attempts to reduce the number of tasks, transfer of work to different locations, reduction and coordination of work force, improving working conditions, and using better adapted tools. The importance of training and use of mock-ups was also emphasized. The impact of ICRP 60 recommendations was considered and it was concluded that this publication will have an impact and will maintain the downward pressure on individual doses which will serve to increase the importance of work management.
